Preposition	Usage	Example
<b>in</b>	used to indicate a location within a larger space or a general time period	1. “She lives in New York City.” or 2. “I usually work in the morning.”
<b>on</b>	used to indicate a surface or a specific date or day	1. “The book is on the table.” or 2. “My birthday is on December 12th.”
<b>at</b>	used to indicate a specific point in time or a specific location	1. “I will meet you at 3 PM.” or 2. “I am at the airport.”
