African Union (AU) - Addis Ababa, Ethiopia (February 6-7)

Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) - Islamabad, Pakistan (March **22-23**)

The OIC summit provided a platform for 57 member states to foster cooperation on shared challenges, ranging from economic development to cultural preservation.

United Nations (UN) - New York City, United States (September 20-21) At the UN summit, representatives from 193 nations discussed peace, human rights, sustainable development, and global cooperation.

Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) - Qingdao, China (June 10-11) The SCO summit brought together eight member states to promote regional security, economic collaboration, and cultural exchanges.

South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC) - Colombo, Sri Lanka (November 27-28)

With eight member nations, SAARC discussed regional development, economic integration, and joint efforts to address common challenges.

Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) - Riyadh, Saudi Arabia (11 Nov, 2023)

The **Joint Arab-Islamic Extraordinary Summit** was held in the city of Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, today, Saturday, November 11, 2023, to discuss the Israeli aggression against the Palestinian people. The Summit was opened by the Crown Prince and Prime Minister, of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, His Royal Highness Prince Mohammed bin Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud, with the participation of



the leaders and heads of government and heads of delegations of the member states of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation and the League of Arab States.

African Union (AU) - Malabo, Equatorial Guinea (February 4-5)

The AU summit reiterated its commitment to intracontinental cooperation, conflict resolution, and sustainable development.

Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) - Jakarta, Indonesia (April 27-28)

[1] The Summit, which is the top hierarchical body in the Eurasian organization, assumed significance for various reasons. SCO member states explored avenues for enhanced security cooperation, economic integration, and cultural understanding.



South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC) - Kathmandu, Nepal (November 23-24)

SAARC nations continued discussions on poverty alleviation, regional connectivity, and disaster response mechanisms.
