- 1. English Essays,
- 2. English Precis and Composition,
- 3. General Science and Ability,
- 4. Current Affairs,
- 5. Pakistan Affairs, and
- 6. Islamic Studies/Ethics for non-Muslims.

The optional papers cover a wide range of subjects, including Accounting and Auditing, Agriculture, Anthropology, Business Administration, Computer Science, International Relations, Journalism and Mass Communication, Political Science, Psychology, and more. The aspirants have to choose any 600 hundred marks subjects from the optional papers. 6# Css Exam Requirements

5. Character:

Candidates must possess good moral character and have no criminal record.

6. Language Proficiency:

Candidates must be proficient in English and Urdu languages. They must be able to read, write, and speak in both languages.

7. **Domicile:**

Candidates must possess a domicile of any province of Pakistan.

8. Number of Attempts:

Candidates can appear for the CSS exam three times in total.
