The rupiah was initially pegged to the US dollar, but this peg was abandoned in 1971. Since then, the rupiah has been subject to high inflation and has lost much of its value against the dollar.

The rupiah is used in all transactions in Indonesia. It is also accepted in some neighboring countries, such as Malaysia and Singapore.
